


Polytechnic with well furnished class rooms, laboretories, library etc. Every class room has digital projector and CCTV cameras.

10. PLANNING PROCESS

The planning on academic, research and extension aspects are through discussion at different levels. The suggestions, comments, recommendations, etc.are invited from faculty members and discussed in the meeting of the Head of the departments. The agenda items are placed

before the board of studies. Further the agenda items are recommended to Academic council for approval. The academic council subsequently approves or defers the decision and placed before the Board of management for approval. Subsequently the notification/implementation orders are issued by the Registrar for implementation.

The academic branch of this college prepares time table (theory & practical) for UG teaching and arranges internal theory and practical examination as per academic calendar under the supervision of Academic Incharge. RAWE programme coordinator and his team provide planning of RAWE programme and educational tour. The Gymkhana Chairman in consultation with the physical instructor follows sports calendar as per the university. Student Representative Council (SRC) Chairman with committee of faculties and students planning for extra-curricular activities, celebration of college annual day, national days and other events of the college. The College of Agriculture also prepares annual report every year.

Academic calendar and time table of centralized common semester end examination are being proposed in the meeting of all the Registrars and Deans of all the four SAUs of Gujarat for their approval.

The new technical programmes relevant to thrust area are prepared by faculties and put up in the respective sub-committee, which are then approved in Joint AGRESCO of the University and finally approved by combined Joint AGRESCO of SAU's of Gujarat. The technical programme approved is taken up by concerned proposer.



18. ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- To perform the various agricultural activities, the state Government (Mumbai state)established research farm in 1955 at Waghai in Dangs district and was initially under the control of State Agriculture Department. It was transferred to erstwhile Gujarat Agricultural University in 1972 and to the Navsari Agricultural University in 2004.
- The whole campus is located at two different places and located 4 km apart from each other. One is situated on the left side of road to Ahwa in village Rajendrapur, just 200 m from Waghai village circle. The total area is about 13.47 hectares. It has (i) Main

- Hill Millet Research Station (ii) KrishiVigyan Kendra (iii) Agricultural Polytechnic erstwhile Agriculture Cooperation & Marketing and (iv) College of Agriculture.
- The other farm is situated in Rambhas village on the road to Saputara. The total area of it is about 10.05 hectares, where only research activities are going on.
- Agricultural schooling started in Dangs in 1985-86 which was later upgraded to the Polytechnic in Agriculture cooperation and marketing in 2010-11 and thereafter to Polytechnic in Agriculture from 2014-15.
- However, there was no facility of higher education based specially on Agriculture and allied fields. This was more needed particularly for sons and daughters of poor tribals, small and marginal farmers who could ill afford to send their wards to far off places in Gujarat or outside the state. Hence, there was a strong need to establish an institute which can cater to the educational need of tribal population with respect to Agriculture and allied fields in particular. So, the Government of Gujarat under Tribal Sub-Plan decided to establish full-fledged College of Agriculture at Waghai which is a constituent college of Navsari Agricultural University.
- Thus, College of Agriculture started functioning from 2012-13 and students are admitted to four years B.Sc.(Hons.) Agriculture degree programme for the first time in July, 2012.
- If we focus on growth of the college, initially the college was started in RKVY building.





- After completing less than one year, college shifted to new building of Polytechnic with well furnished class rooms, laboretories, library etc. Every class room has digital projector and CCTV cameras.
- A new building of Girls hostel with 100 capacity is also established at this centre.

• A new degree college building as well as boys hostel of 160 capacity are under construction and will be available by December -2016.
