Introduction

College of Agricultural Engineering and Technology was established under Vanbandhu Kalyan scheme by Government of Gujarat in tribal, rural and forest area of Narmada district in 2012. The College has the mandate for conducting strategic research on design and development of technologies/equipments in the area of Farm Machinery & Power, Processing and Food Engineering, Soil and Water Engineering and Renewable Energy Engineering with extension of technologies to farmers and entrepreneurs. The college is located at Parsi Tekra, Dediapada, 72 km east from Ankleshwar railway station and 45 km south from Rajpipala. There are Six departments working on Renewable energy engineering, Soil and water conservation Engineering, Processing and Food Engineering, Farm Power Engineering, Irrigation and drainage engineering and Basic Engineering and Applied Sciences and there by carrying out various activities of education, research and extension.
