

## **FUTURISTIC TECHNOLOGIES IN HORTICULTURE**











#### **Background**

Horticulture plays important role in agricultural growth and development and it has tremendous potential for transformation of the nation's economy by providing food and nutritional security, employment and business development, besides providing livelihood to small and marginal farmers and ecological benefits. It has become a key driver for economic development in many of the states in the country and contributes 30.4 per cent to GDP of agriculture. The production of horticultural produce has increased seven fold, which ensured nutritional security and employment opportunities. Export growth of fresh fruits and vegetables in terms of value is 14 per cent and of processed fruits and vegetables is 16.27 per cent. Globally, India is the second highest producer of fruits and vegetables with largest producer of mango, banana, coconut, cashew, papaya, pomegranate and highest producer and exporter of spices. It ranks first in productivity of grapes, banana, cassava, peas, papaya, etc.

With fast changing tools/technologies and challenges of fast rising population, unemployment, malnutrition, contamination/toxicity of foods, shrinking land & water resources and adverse effects of climate change has put us on the crossroads to look for new strategies and formulate the sustainable plan to cope up with the challenges. Keeping the above facts in mind, a Horticulture Conclave on "Futuristic Technologies in Horticulture", is being organized during December 8-10, 2019 in Lucknow. The event will provide a platform to researchers, academicians/ scholars, entrepreneurs, farmers, development agencies, policy makers and other agencies to discuss, review and formulate the action plan for "Horticultural Revolution" in the country.

#### **Objectives**

The Progressive Horticulture Conclave-2019 will encompass following objectives:

- ❖ To boost the economy of our country by increasing the horticulture production
- ❖ New generation tools and techniques in horticultural crops for doubling income
- Explore and utilize the diversity of under-exploited/lesser known indigenous horticultural crops

- Technological interventions in crop health management

- Horticulture for promoting health, healing, happiness, environment & horti-tourism

- Future needs and strategies in horticultural education, research and development, extension for promoting skill and entrepreneurship
- Farmers support system with new policies, IPR, accreditation/ certification etc.
- Horticulture for women empowerment

The Progressive Horticulture Conclave-2019 is open to all stakeholders interested in horticulture R&D and representatives from public/private sectors, central and state government ministries, scientists and students from agricultural institutes and universities, farmers, representatives from international agencies, farmers' associations, agriinput suppliers/associations (like seeds, fertilizers, plant protection chemicals, growers association, NGOs, etc.). The deliberations of the Conclave shall be in English.

#### About the Society and ICAR-CISH, Lucknow

Indian Society of Horticulture Research and Development (ISHRD) was established in March 1969 as the Hill Horticulture Development Board (HHDB) at the Horticulture Experiment and Training Center (HETC,) Chaubattia, Ranikhet Almora (Now in Uttarakhand). Promotion of research in Horticulture and publication of a journal was the dream of the then Director, Dr SS Teotia. A journal 'Progressive Horticulture' was started. Luminaries like Dr JN Seth, Dr RP Srivastava, Dr PL Gautam, Dr HP Singh and Dr RK Pathak have contributed immensely towards the growth of the Society and its journal which is regularly publishing significant research in horticulture which is the second oldest journal in Horticulture in the country and widely cited by scientific fraternity. The journal has entered its Golden Jubilee year in 2019. The journal is available online on <a href="www.indianjournals.com">www.indianjournals.com</a> and on the society's website <a href="www.progressivehorticulture.in">www.progressivehorticulture.in</a>. The journal is published biannually in June and December. General Body meeting of the society will also be held during the conclave. Date and time will be intimated later.

ICAR-CISH, Lucknow situated at Rehmankhera on Hardoi Road, Lucknow was started as Central Mango Research Station in 1972 and upgraded to the level of Institute in 1984. The Institute has been catering to the needs of farmers and fruit growers in field of subtropical horticulture for last more than 40 years. The Institute has developed several improved varieties of mango (Ambika and Arunika), guava (Lalit, Shweta, Dhawal and Lalima,), bael (CISH-B1, CISH-B2) and jamun (CISH-Jamwant) besides developing technologies in crop production, protection, post-harvest management and value addition for enhancing productivity and farmers' income. Rejuvenation technology in mango developed by the Institute has made significant impact in the country. The Institute has more than 750 accessions of mango in the Field Gene Bank (FGB).

#### Presentation/Awards

The Conclave will cover lead and invited lectures, oral and poster presentations in each theme area. Detailed presentation schedules/programmes and guidelines will be made available on our website <a href="https://www.progressivehorticulture.in">www.progressivehorticulture.in</a>.

**Lead/Invited Papers:** Lead papers on pertinent topics highlighting the central theme of each session will be invited from leading researchers & academicians. **Oral and Poster Presentations:** Both members and non-members of society within India and abroad may send their abstracts which would be peer reviewed and shall be selected by the editorial committee for oral/poster presentation. Abstract(s) of only registered authors will be published in the Book of Abstracts and presented as poster papers in the three-day event. The poster should be sent in pdf format before the due dates. Arrangements will be made for E-poster presentation for which the size of poster should be 4x3 feet, font Calibri, font size - Title 48; Subtitle 44; Text 36. Best oral/poster presentation will be awarded. In addition, there will be separate award for the paper coming out of thesis work and best women researcher in horticulture.

The society awards have already been announced and selected awardees will be honoured during the conclave.

#### **Abstract**

The abstract should be prepared in MS word not exceeding 250 words. It must contain a clear title, name and affiliation of the authors. The name of the presenting author should be underlined and E-mail should be given at the end. There should not be any sub-headings, figures, tables or references in the abstract. The abstract may be submitted through email and/or by post along with a soft copy. The detailed specifications for preparing the poster paper, would be mailed to those authors whose abstracts are accepted for poster presentation. #### **About Lucknow**

Lucknow is famous for its culture, art and tradition. Its geographical area of 3,244 sq. km with several educational and research Institutions like ICAR, CSIR, ICMR, UGC, etc. Bara Imambara, Chota Imambara, Rumi Darwaza, Clock Tower, Chattar Manzil, Residency, Shaheed Smarak are some of the important heritage sites. Lucknow is world famous for its chikankari work. Malihabad and Kakori in Lucknow are famous for its 'Dashehari' mangoes which has been given GI Tag. It is one of the most popular mango varieties and widely acclaimed for its exquisite taste and pleasant aroma. It is believed that 80 per cent of the area under mango in Malihabad and Kakori is covered with Dashehari only and it can be genetically traced back to "Mother Dashehari" plant still existing in Dashehari village of Kakori. During early December, the weather at Lucknow will be cool & pleasant. Warm clothing is required during the period.

#### How to reach Lucknow

Lucknow is well connected by Air, Train and Road from all major cities of the country. Nearest airport (CCS International Airport, Amausi, Lucknow), nearest railway station [Lucknow (LKO) /Lucknow Junction (LJN)] and nearest bus stations (Alambagh, Charbagh and Quaiserbagh) are 5 to 10 km from the venue.
